Disaster Relief and Community Disaster Education

When a disaster threatens or strikes, the Red Cross is there. This year, we responded to **14** local disasters, of which **86** percent were residential fires. Massive June flooding was the largest response for our Chapter, our response included emergency food, shelter, supplies and personnel.

Massive June flooding was the largest expense, **\$121,721**, and response for our Chapter, ever. Our emergency response included housing in hotels or shelters for **504** people. Also, **72** assistance cards and **2,628** clean-up kits were distributed. In all, **47** local volunteers came together with **64** volunteers from all over the country, to help the residents of Fond du Lac during the flood.

In addition, **six** of our **53** Disaster Action Team members worked on National Disaster Relief Operations including fires, floods and winter storms.

Six *Dare to Prepare* presentations educated **157** children in basic disaster preparedness.



Health and Safety Services

From first aid, CPR and AED training to swimming and lifeguarding, American Red Cross programs help people lead safer and healthier lives. This year, **5,154** individuals learned life-saving skills through **545** classes offered by the Chapter.

Services to Armed Forces (SAF)

The American Red Cross provided communication between those in the Armed Forces and their families. We have a worldwide network to reach service members wherever they are to communicate a birth, death or illness. This year, we provided briefings and emergency connections for **25** military families.

Blood Services

Over the last year, we helped run **52** community blood drives, collecting **2,805** units of blood. There were **49** private business and campus drives. This number continues to grow. There were **209** first time donors.

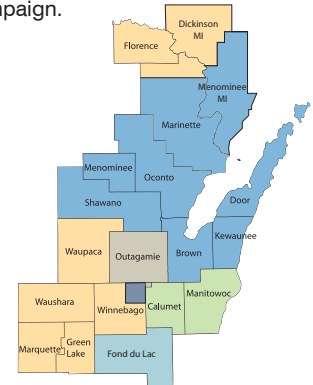
Community Services

A Note About Volunteers

We depend on volunteers of all ages and backgrounds to carry on our work. Volunteers constitute **97** percent of our total workforce, serving as members of the board, instructors teaching lifesaving skills, disaster action team members, office administrators, event organizers and more.

This year, **146** volunteers made the work of the Chapter possible. Among them were **nine** college interns volunteering their time working on projects, such as, Dare to Prepare, Ride4Red, Touchdown for Red Cross, Test Drive for Red Cross, and the Heroes Campaign.
